#### **BIOGRAPHY**

Harald Hau is a Professor of Economics and Finance at the Geneva School of Economics and Management (GSEM) of the University of Geneva, the managing director of the Geneva Finance Research Institute (GFRI) and holds a senior chair at the Swiss Finance Institute (SFI).

His research interests are in international finance, financial markets and financial stability. After his PhD at Princeton University in 1996 with Kenneth Rogoff as thesis advisor, he first taught at the French business school ESSEC and from 2001 to 2011 at INSEAD in Fountainebleau and Singapore. He was a visiting professor at the University of California, Berkeley, a visiting scholar at the International Monetary Fund, the Wim Duisenberg Fellow at the European Central Bank and a research fellow at the Hong Kong Institute for Monetary Research.

He is a fellow at the Center for Economic Policy Research (CEPR), London, and the Center for Economic Studies (CES), Munich. In his research, he contributes to academic and professional journals such as the American Economic Review, Review of Financial Studies, Journal of Finance, Journal of Financial Economics, Economic Policy, and others.

#### PANEL I: SOME OPTIMISM: OVERCOMING DEBT, INFLATION AND GENERATING SUSTAINABLE GROWTH

Public debt soared to a record during the pandemic, topping global gross domestic product. Now, with government debt still elevated, the rise in interest rates and the strong US dollar are adding to interest costs, in turn weighing on growth and fueling financial stability risks. With several economies already in debt distress it is crucial to consider how to tackle these challenges. This panel will explore the challenges and possible approaches to managing and reducing public debts.

Key questions we will examine include:

- How have countries successfully reduced public debt ratios in the past?
- What are the short- and medium-term effects of fiscal consolidations and debt restructuring on debt ratios, and how do they interact?
- Under which conditions are fiscal consolidations and debt restructurings more likely to durably reduce debt ratios?

Crypto asset markets experienced a highly volatile year. Market valuations dropped from a peak of nearly \$3 trillion in 2021 to less than 1 trillion this year. At the same time, the industry saw the collapse of important players such as Terra and FTX. Regulators across the world are paying increasing attention to crypto assets and standard-setting bodies are considering the regulatory response to crypto assets. This panel will bring together representatives from the industry to discuss the future of the crypto assets ecosystem. # 12:30 - 13:30 PANEL III: GOVERNANCE OF NATURAL RESOURCES, RENEWAL ENERGY, BIODIVERSITY AND GREEN/SOCIAL FINANCE

The effectiveness and equity of natural resource governance processes critically determine both the extent to which ecosystems contribute to human well-being and the long-term prospects for the sustainable conservation of nature. Securing rights and sharing power, responsibilities, and operational resources required to strengthen natural resource governance benefits both people and biodiversity. Transitioning to renewable energy requires the integration of ESG factors into firms' business models—prompted by regulators, businesses' own interests, or investors— which may help mitigate these risks. Policymakers, practitioners, and academics have a role to play in developing standards, fostering disclosure and transparency, and promoting the integration of sustainability considerations into investments and businesses. This panel will discuss how governance, transition to renewable energy, and green finance are the necessary foundation for a just world that values and conserves nature and contributes to the achievement of global sustainable development goals.

# 13:30 - 14:30 PANEL VI: STRUCTURAL REFORMS AND ESG: BUILDING RESILIENCE

Curbing illicit financial flow and ensuring ownership and inclusiveness of reforms are key to successful reform implementation. Structural reforms boost potential growth and economic resilience. They facilitate the efficient allocation of resources within an economy, speed up the adjustment to shocks, and boost potential, and eventually actual, growth. In addition, structural reforms can also increase demand and accelerate economic recovery. The short-term effects vary depending on the type of reforms, size of the shocks, and complementarities between market initiations and other policy settings. This panel will discuss how policy priorities should be centered on strengthening the education, health, and social protection systems, tackling water scarcity and climate issues, and fostering an environment conducive to private investment and job creation.
